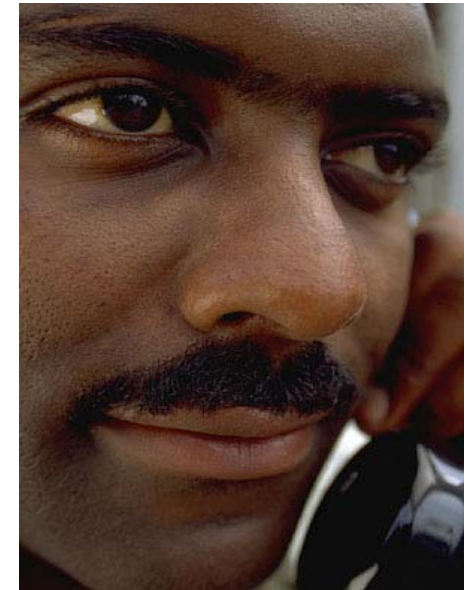

Judicial Support Services



We're a good family to know.

When you receive an alcohol or drug-related traffic offense, you are required by law to be referred to a Substance Abuse Traffic Offenders Program, or “SATOP”. SATOP is a state-certified network of comprehensive programs which provides an appropriate response to alcohol and drug related traffic offenses. Preferred Family Healthcare is a SATOP provider for northern Missouri.

Step One: Screening

All offenders* referred to SATOP are evaluated through an initial screening. You must call Preferred Family Healthcare to make an appointment for your screening.

The screening includes use of a standardized computer-screening test, a review of the offender’s driving record, and an interview with a qualified professional. The screening takes about 2 hours.

We then recommend the most appropriate level of service. The recommendation is based on criteria established by the Department of Mental Health and the judgment of a qualified professional. The total cost of screening is \$245, which is determined by the Missouri Department of Mental Health. (\$120 for the screening by Preferred Family Healthcare and \$125 for the Department of Mental Health.)

*Except minor in possession, abuse and lose, and first-offense zero tolerance offenders. See “Under 21” section.

Step Two: Intervention

Participants must register for all programs in advance by calling Preferred Family Healthcare.

Option 1: Offender Education Program

Offender Education Program is a 10-hour education program to assist students in understanding the effects that drinking has on driving skills, warning signs of chemical dependency, and location area resources for support.

Option 2: Weekend Intervention Program

The Weekend Intervention Program is an intensive counseling, intervention and education program conducted in 48 consecutive hours in a restrictive environment over the course of a weekend. (From 4:00 p.m. Friday until 4:00 p.m. Sunday) The program is designed primarily for, but not limited to second-time DWI offenders.

The Weekend Intervention Program activities include an assessment, a medical needs screening, group education, group counseling, individual counseling and other intervention so students will assess their personal responsibility in the area of impaired driving.

The program uses a course curriculum approved by the Missouri Department of Mental Health. The cost of the program is based on the Department’s Standard Means Test, but is a minimum of \$100 and a maximum of \$350.

Option 3: Clinical Intervention Program

This outpatient program designed specifically for persistent DWI offenders. This six-week program includes 20 hours of group

counseling, 20 hours of group education, and 10 hours of individual counseling with a qualified professional.

The Clinical Intervention Program is convenient for those offenders with full-time jobs as well as those with child care responsibilities. Assistance with child care is available. Cost is based on the Missouri Department of Mental Health Standard Means Test, with a minimum cost of \$100.

Aggressive Offenders

Aggressive Offenders program is for those with aggressive behaviors, especially when legal entanglements occur. This course examines methods to resolve conflict, promote anger management, enhance communication skills, examine work and home relationships, and ways to adapt to lifestyle changes. This class meets one night a week for two hours over an eight-week period.

Children in Between

Children in Between helps parents recognize their children’s needs during a divorce, separation, or post-dissolution litigation. Parents learn positive way to reduce the impact of divorce, prevention techniques so children will not be caught in parent arguments, and effective problem-solving skills. This two-part seminar is held once a month and meets for four hours. The cost is based on a sliding fee scale and registration.
